Ireland has awarded its highest diasporan honour to Queensland Irish Association Vice-President Séamus Sullivan.

Séamus travelled to Dublin to pick up his Presidential Distinguished Service Award for his support for the Irish community in Australia.

The award was conferred by President Michael D. Higgins in Áras an Uachtaráin, his official residence in Phoenix Park, on January 16th. This was followed by a dinner hosted by the Tánaiste, Micheál Martin, with the Minister of State for International Development and Diaspora, Seán Fleming, in Dublin Castle.

Séamus has contributed to the Irish-Australian community in many ways over the past 50 years, including assisting those in personal crisis, and promoting and sharing Irish culture in Brisbane, Queensland, and Australia. He was awarded in the category of Irish Community Support.

The Presidential Distinguished Service Award for the Irish Abroad was established by the government in 2012, and to date 120 people have been conferred with the award.

This year has seen awards conferred on people across seven continents and Séamus is the only one from the Irish diaspora in Australia.

Well done Séamus and we look forward to seeing your award in person!

In addition to our sad losses last year of three prominent Life Members of the QIA, namely Mark Morrissey, Leo Moloney and Noela McCormick, we have this year suffered two further losses of Life Members, to the great detriment of the Association.

Pauline became a Life Member in 2012.



# Derry Girls star lifts the cloak of mystery around St Brigid

Actor Siobhán McSweeney has form in telling the story of formidable Catholic teachers - she played no-nonsense, cynical school principal Sister Michael in Derry Girls. So she had no hesitation in taking part in a documentary investigating the story of Irish educator St Brigid, who she said she had seen portrayed in Celtic fantasy books as "a warrior poet and goddess".

The documentary, Finding Brigid, unfolds on the eve of St Brigid's Day 2023, the first time the day would be designated a public holiday in Ireland. Siobhán goes on a quest to uncover the real Brigid, unraveling the tangled threads of fact and folklore.

Now, on its first anniversary, Queensland Irish Association is set to screen Finding Brigid at a school named after the Saint in Brisbane.

St Brigid founded Kildare Monastery, a centre of religion and learning for both men and woman. Throughout her life, St Brigid became synonymous with acts of charity, hospitality, and the protection of women in need. Recognised for miracles and acts of healing, she holds a significant place in Irish Christian tradition.

The documentary takes viewers on a journey from the sacred wells of Ireland to the hallowed grounds of Glastonbury in England, exploring legends, myths, and the legacy of St Brigid.

As Siobhán encounters various figures, including Church of Ireland Bishop of Meath and Kildare, Pat Storey, and former President of Ireland Mary McAleese, the documentary navigates the complexities of Brigid's existence as a historical figure, a Christian saint, and a goddess revered in pagan traditions.

Join this cinematic exploration of St Brigid at The Brigid Centre, Brigidine College, Indooroopilly, on Saturday, 10th February at 2pm.



## Ulster experts visit to help families trace their history

Two experts from Ulster Historical Foundation will help you unlock your Irish and Scots-Irish family history at Queensland Family History Society in February.

You can advance your knowledge of Irish research at this special morning. This event is your gateway to tracing your roots, connecting with your ancestors, and embracing your unique heritage.

The program looks at the importance of gravestone inscriptions and funerary monuments in Irish research, Irish education and school records, and getting the most out of Griffith's Valuation.

Visiting expert Fintan Mullan is the Executive Director of the Ulster Historical Foundation. A pioneer in the creation of online resources for Irish research, Fintan has maintained the Foundation's prominence in digital database developments for Irish genealogy.

He has also managed the production of over 100 publications, including the

popular Researching Scots-Irish Ancestors, and has lectured extensively on Irish history and genealogy in the UK, US, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand.

Also giving the talk will be Gillian Hunt, Research Officer with the Ulster Historical Foundation. Gillian is responsible for managing the Foundation's many genealogical activities. She also carries out research for clients and is a hugely experienced user of the Public Record Of-


