Join us for spectacular St Patrick's Day celebrations

The Brisbane Irish Festival campaigns for events of particular interest and relevance to Members of Queensland Irish Association.

In celebration of the feast day of Saint Patrick, the Saint Patrick's Day Parade will be held on Saturday, 16th March 2024, commencing at 10.30am. The parade will start at City Botanic Gardens on Alice Street, then process through the streets before returning to the Botanic Gardens.

The QIA will again have its 1914
Fiat truck carrying the figure of
Saint Patrick, and we are grateful to
Veteran QIA stalwart Jim Kendall
for again hosting the QIA truck. In
addition, we require as many QIA
Members and supporters as possible to walk and accompany the QIA
float. Members and supporters are
asked to assemble at 10.15am, outside
the Botanic Gardens main entrance,
behind the QIA truck.

Please email Mary Allen at mary@ queenslandirish.com.au if you are able to march in support of the St Patrick's Day Parade. Or find her behind the QIA float on the day, she will be handing out QIA stickers to say that you are with us.

In addition to the QIA walkers, we will be accompanied by QIA stilt walkers, which will add to the celebration for spectators.

The second event to celebrate the feast of Saint Patrick is the Saint Patrick's Eve Dinner, which will be held this year in the magnificent Main Auditorium of the Brisbane City Hall on Saturday evening, 16th March

The Governor of Queensland Jeannette Rosita Young AC PSM and Professor Nimmo will attend the St Patrick's Eve Dinner for the first time, and the Chief Justice of Queensland, Helen Bowskill, will be attending for her second occasion.

It will be a great night in anticipation of the feast of Saint Patrick.

On St Patrick's Day, Sunday, March 17th, the traditional St Patrick's Day Mass will not be in its usual form because of the feast day falling on a Sunday. The Mass for the fifth Sunday of Lent will only have brief references to Saint Patrick, but the Mass, which is the Cathedral of St Stephen in Brisbane, will have two pipers from the Queensland Irish Association Pipe Band playing outside the entrance before Mass. Queensland Irish Association Members and guests can join in the Francis Rush Centre for morning tea after the 10am Mass.

QIA's celebration of St Patrick's Day will be concluded with the QIA St Patrick's Day Lunch, to be held from

Irish Lord's son's forgotten grave is found in Toowong

The long-forgotten, vandalised and overgrown grave of the son of an Irish Lord has been found in a Brisbane cemetery and restored to its former glory.

Heritage-listed Toowong Cemetery is the largest cemetery in Queensland, with its first burial taking place in1871. A group of volunteers, Friends of Toowong Cemetery, restores broken headstones and researches the history of the monuments, as well as conducting tours.

Darcy Maddock from Friends of Toowong Cemetery recently lifted a broken headstone to discover that the grave belonged to the son of an Irish Lord.

Darcy contacted Queensland Irish Association seeking help with lifting the marble headsone back onto its base and restoring it.

Darcy said at the time: "I found an Irishman who deserves to be visited but the headstone has been vandalised. I am sure it can be repaired. The lovely cross is in two pieces which I can put back together with a special adhesive."

Speaking about the inscription on the headstone, Darcy said: "His name is Bentinck Yelverton Bingham, he is the third son of John Charles Robert Bingham, fourth Baron of Clanmorris, Creg Clare, Co. Galway."

Queensland Irish Association Friends and Supporters Facebook group ran a request for help from the Irish community. We are very grateful to Kevin Morrissey, who volunteered to help.

Research is ongoing by Friends of Toowong Cemetery on the history of the young man in the grave, and so far it is a very sad story.

According to the research undertaken by Darcy Maddock so far,

Bentinck Yelverton Bingham was born in Galway and came out to Australia when he was just 20 years old. He was notified of an inheritance and went home to Ireland, then came back to Queensland with money. He invested in property but was ripped off and became mentally disturbed. He ended up in an asylum in the year he died, aged 36. The headstone was erected by his brother and sister.

Work undertaken on the grave included cleaning, painting the railings and putting down artificial grass.

The grave will be included in

Queensland Irish Association's Irish history tour of the cemetery, in association with Friends of Toowong Cemetery, as part of our St Patrick's Day celebrations.

This will be a guided walk and fascinating talk on the lives of the prominent Irish people buried in the cemetery as participants visit their grave sites.

The tour will take place on Sunday, 10th March at 10am.



Board is a new pub in Dublin's city centre that offers an extensive range of non-alcoholic drinks together with over 200 board games that patrons can play for free.

The recently opened dry pub has become an instant hit with locals and visitors alike and is filled nightly with people in high spirits, though not of the 40% proof kind.

The idea behind Board is to create a space that has the look and feel of a modern Irish pub but without the alcohol. It stocks premium 0% beers, a wide range of alcohol-free craft beers and, of course, has the famous 'black stuff' Guinness 0.0 on draught.

Board also offers an impressive mocktail list mimicking favourite classics such as Espresso Martinis Aperol Spritzs and Bloody Marys and over 30 non-alcoholic spirits. A menu of Mood Boosters made with a natural mix of botanicals, herbs, spices or mushrooms are designed to sooth or stimulate as required, and the non-al-

coholic wines available include Irish-owned Hollow Leg, produced in Spain.

The comprehensive games collection caters for those who enjoy the classics, such as Monopoly and Yahtzee, to groups who want to conquer the world in Risk or Catan, have a noisy competition with Articulate! or just enjoy a quiet game of chess.

To complement the drinks menu there is a food menu available all day offering tasty meals and sweet treats, with vegan options. From 4pm Board offers homemade pizzas.


As well as board games there is lots of entertainment including regular jazz nights, comedy events, pub quizzes, bingo and sports screenings in the pub.

The Six Nations Championship, which kicked off at the beginning of February, is the first major sporting event to be screened in the pub and Board has expectations for a full house for every match and a great atmosphere.

Dublin is a city with a thriving pub scene and is renowned for the 'craic' to be found in its cosy bars and cosmopolitan clubs.

Board adds another dimension to this with a space to meet, eat and play without involving alcohol.

The Guard is a 2011 Irish buddy cop comedy film written and directed by John Michael McDonagh, starring Brendan Gleeson, Don Cheadle, Mark Strong and Liam Cunningham.

The film received critical acclaim and was a box-office success. Both Gleeson and Cheadle received acclaim for their performances, with Gleeson receiving
